In 1974 The West Midlands Federation was formed and 2024 is our 50th Anniversary Year. We are in the process of planning our Annual Meeting and other events to mark the occasion.

It was in 1974 that NFWI announced its decision to realign Federations with Local Authority Boundaries. The subscription was increased to \pounds 1:00, supported strongly by a person who said that having recently paid just over 27p for a small pork chop that the WI provided much more value than four pork chops!!!

One event that also took place that year shocked the City of Birmingham to its core; the Pub Bombings will forever be remembered.

Bagpuss, the children's television series aired for the first time.

The kidnap attempt on Princess Anne failed.

ABBA won the Eurovision Contest with the song "Waterloo".

Five previous all male Colleges at Oxford admitted women undergraduates for the first time.

Berkswell WI member Innes Brett is celebrating 80 years as a WI member. In 1944 Innes joined her mother's WI in Hampshire during the war at the age of 15. A time of 'Make do and Mend.'

When Innes came to Berkswell to teach, the WI held afternoon meetings and she was able to join the meeting when school finished. When they were changed to afternoon and evenings Innes was able to become a full-time member in 1966.

Innes has served on the WI County Executive Committee. National Public Affairs Sub-Committee and held the position of West Midlands County Chairman 1995-1998. She is also a trustee of the WMFWI Educational Trust. a charity created after the closure of Knowle's WI. and the sale of its hut. It raised over £200000, which was ethically invested and is now available to offer cash grants for members of two years or more, to attend educational courses. She wrote a poem to raise awareness, and read it at the WMFWI conference.

She is delighted to be a member of a great organisation which benefits women of all ages and backgrounds.
